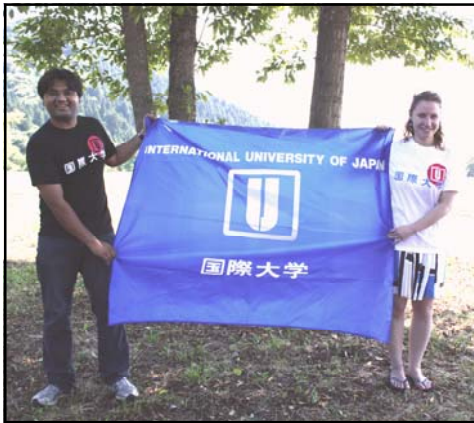
Message from Anki Winkler:

Global Women's Mentor Network

Career Services and Alumni Relations have teamed up again to expand our A-CAN program (Alumni Career Advisor's Network). A-CAN allows IUJ students to informally interact with alumni volunteers for career advice and guidance.

Now, IUJ women are formally matched up in mentoring relationships for academic advice related to career objectives while at IUJ, and for career exploration and job hunt support.

In February, IUJ alumni were

invited to volunteer and before the initial emails had even been delivered, replies started coming in. In the end, over 100 IUJ ladies replied that they would be happy to be a Mentor. We began making the first match-ups and will expand the program with the incoming students this September.

The new Executive Council for the period 2009-2012 was elected a few months back. Since Tomohito Shinoda (IR86) decided to step down from the position of Chairperson, the Executive Council elected Yasu Kojima (IM02) as the new Chairperson.

As outlined below, currently the Executive Council has taken up three projects and is in the process of getting detailed goals and activities planned for each.

Alumni Networking: Strengthening the alumni network and further improving the coordination (Lead: Viswa Ghosh, IR92)

In more precise terms, the proposal is to organize a gathering of the Class

Reps on July 24th. Class Reps' meeting will then discuss and plan the "IUJ World Wide Friday" at Tokyo. IUJ Alumni Office is considering to organize this during mid-October in Tokyo, subject to approval by the Class Reps on July 24th.

The Class Reps gathering will also consider ways and means of increasing alumni participation during planned gatherings as well as updating the Alumni contact list so that every alumni can be properly informed of all events and activities.

IUJ-Alumni Relations: Assisting IUJ graduates to find employment and provide Curriculum / Research related support.

Consider ways and means of helping IUJ graduates find employment; offering to visit IUJ as a guest speaker and interacting with the students, etc. It has been agreed that travel costs from Tokyo to IUJ for the alumni and alumni-organized guest speakers will be reimbursed. Consider the needs of IUJ students and organize activities that will meet those needs.

Fund raising by Alumni: Continuation of the "ThANKs Fund" and other measures of improving fund collection (Lead: Tomohito Shinoda)

Many alumni have already contributed to the "ThANKS Fund." The Executive Council will consider activities in continuation of the same. Enhanced fund raising will not only help in improving facilities at the school but also will help to increase scholarships to more students as was achieved last year. ThANKS Fund scholarship recipients are chosen by the IR and IM faculty and approved by Alumni EC. One 2nd year student from each school is awarded the support for their contribution to campus interaction and community service, plus potential to contribute as an IUJ alum to strengthen our international community.

We are launching an IUJ T-shirts campaign to encourage alumni's financial contribution to this fund, and look forward to your participation.

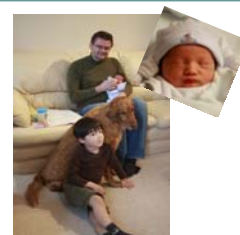

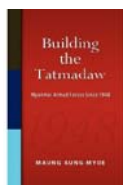

Kibosho Hospital, Tanzania seeks Ambulance

Kibosho Hospital is suffering from the lack of an ambulance that could help prevent unnecessary deaths.

Innocent Shiyo (IR03) is a major volunteer and contributor to a key hospital in the Kilimanjaro region and asks for your support. In 2007, Innocent lost his father due to the lack of emergency transport needed to take him just 9K to another facility. He asks for our help to provide for this transportation. Professionally, Innocent serves on the High Commission of the United Republic of Tanzania.

Kibosho Hospital is one of the three hospitals of the Diocese of Moshi in the Kilimanjaro Region, and a District Designated Hospital (DDH). It serves 28 villages with an estimated population of 283,411. It started as a dispensary in 1929 consisting of one building with 7 rooms only and few mud huts. The present wards were built between 1958 and 1965. Currently there are sixteen dispensaries operating under the direct supervision of Kibosho Hospital.

Kibosho Hospital is suffering from the lack of an ambulance. An ambulance is badly needed not only for transporting emergency patients, but to help coordinate the activities of the sixteen dispensaries. For a couple of years now the hospital staff has been depending on unreliable

public transport and a very limited number of private cars hired by patients themselves to transfer patients needing emergency transfer. This is a major problem facing the Hospital Management.

Transferring a patient from Kibosho Hospital to a higher level facility can take an entire day. Similarly, sending transportation to pick up an emergency patient means no other transportation is available in the event of a second emergency or the immediate need for a patient transfer. The staff is constantly faced with having to decide when to send emergency transportation because doing so – if it is indeed possible in the first place – may mean no other transport is available in an emergency on that same day. This creates a terrify-

ing situation for the staff, and has certainly been the cause of many deaths.

Kibosho Hospital is asking for help to acquire an ambulance. The requested ambulance will enable the hospital to transfer patients needing emergency transfers more smoothly thereby saving a lot of lives. The hospital will maintain the car and will also cover the running costs.

While keeping my fingers crossed for your total support, please accept you all, my best wishes for your continued personal good health and success in your endeavours. Thanks

Atsushi Nezu (IR90)

The 2007 statistics showed that the number of the homeless in Japan was 18,564. The current economic disaster has increased this number. A significant phenomenon is that not only in metropolitan areas like Tokyo, Osaka and Nagoya but also the rural areas are facing issues regarding the homeless. I moved to Toyama prefecture last year after finishing a Master's in Social Work

at Carleton University (CU) in Canada. Here, I started several projects to help the people living on the streets.

I organized the 炊き出しクラブ TDC with my students of Toyama College of Welfare Science where I teach courses on Social Work. The TDC members cook and pass rice balls to the people living around Toyama JR station each Thursday. When some people reject our offer, the young students can say "Why not? We 'cooked' these Onigiri!" 食べられ〜 ('Please eat' in Toyama dialect). Their uninhibited attitude succeeded to create a relationship with the people experiencing devastation, isolation and humiliation. Such activities are important because we learn that the "homeless people"

mean not only persons *without a house* but a person *without hope*. The TDC also organizes food distribution including Curry Rice and Soup once a month. Around 30 people show up to eat and enjoy conversations with the young people and some citizens of Toyama who are concerned about the homeless issues.

I also established ホームレス支援隊 (the Corps to help the homeless) with several members of the Toyama Association of Certified Social Workers. We conducted research and interviews with the homeless people last November. In showing the result of our research, we urged the administrations of Toyama city, Takaoka city and Toyama Prefecture to take urgent actions for the present crisis. For

example, many homeless people in Toyama are over 60 years old.

Knowledge and skills of International Relations gained at IUJ and Social Work from CU allow me to take social actions as a Community Organization activity. The experience as a GSO member of IUJ is also important to me for organizing and managing the network among supporters with different backgrounds. I want to utilize these benefits and assets to give back to society. My 'comrades' including my students and I hope to say "Yes, we can" in Toyama.

Mentees will apply to take part in the program. Mentors volunteers will be asked to offer the services. After finalizing the mentee applicants, mentors and chapter leaders will work together to find the best match according to mentors' and mentees' profiles. If the planning stays on

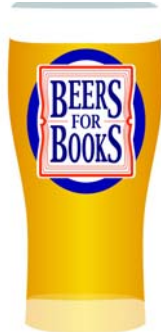
course, the 21 month program will launch with new student recruitment in Fall 2009, and our first PMPP candidates arriving September 2010.
