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Course Introduction

Objectives of Basic Japanese 4-6:

- Students will be able to talk about various topics familiar to them.
- Students will be able to handle successfully a limited number of uncomplicated communicative tasks by creating with the language in straight forward social situations.
- Students will be able to express personal meaning by combining and recombining into short statements what they know.
- Students will be able to initiate and maintain simple conversation.
- Students will be able to attain Intermediate-low in the Oral Proficiency Interview Test at the end of Basic Japanese 6, and a proficiency level equivalent to that of level 3 in The Japanese Language.

2010 Basic Japanese 6 (にほんごきそ 6)
(April – June, 2010)

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In order to achieve the objectives,

- Students will learn basic structural knowledge, vocabulary, and expressions of Japanese for the further development of the language.
- Grammatical construction; when to use a particular form and then practicing it in conversation.
- Main emphasis will be placed on listening and speaking skills, but students will learn reading and writing to enhance their communication skills.

Basic Japanese 6 will include:

- How to express what one has heard from someone else by using そうです.
- How to express one's decision.
- How to express a change in ability or situation.
- How to express that something is/is not done occasionally.
- How to make the causative of verbs and the volitional forms.
- Topics such as; message, asking how to do something, future plan, complaining.
