Course Description:

A series of Japanese courses comprising Elementary 1 through Elementary 3 gives students structural knowledge of the language and ability to understand and utilize sentences and expressions used in daily life.

Learning Objectives:

The course objectives of Elementary 2 are the following:

1. To be able to carry out conversations in several specific situations (e.g.) giving and receiving things, what one wants to do and wishes to have
2. To be able to write and read about 100 kanji (Total from Elementary 1: 200)

In order to achieve the above objectives, we will do the following things:

1. To learn two styles of verb: です・ます style and plain style.
2. Of the four language skills, the development of speaking and listening will be emphasized, though reading and writing will also be cultivated.

Delivery Methods:
