Course Description: The course is composed of (1) lectures on the theories, the practices and cases in PPP, (2) student presentations and (3) discussions. For (2), students are required to provide a 15-minute presentation on an actual PPP example as a part of government reform in his/her own country.

Learning Objectives: Students will learn theories and background of government reform and, as a part of the reform practice, the cooperation between public and private sectors. Also, they will find actual PPP examples in their own country through researches for a presentation required in the class and the term paper.

Career Relevance: PPP is an unavoidable aspect in public sector today. Students would be able to increase their options in delivering public services when they return to their works. For those who have a background with private sector, the course would help to think about business opportunities with public sector.
